As NDP critic for Veterans Affairs, I have the distinct privilege of meeting with and advocating for the courageous people who have served in Canada's Armed Forces. Remembrance Day and the days of commemoration around it, are an important reminder of the sacrifices of Canada's Veterans and current military members, as well as what their families and loved ones have given up.

While we remember and honour the incredible heroism of our Veterans and current Armed Forces members, it is vital we give thought and thanks to the people whose crucial contributions have historically been ignored, or who were barred from serving due to systemic discrimination. Women, Indigenous peoples, and those who were part of the <u>LGBTQ purge</u> have fought to have their experiences heard and respected. The decision to enlist requires bravery, but for too many people that bravery has been disregarded.

In the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs, I have heard too often from women Veterans that they feel invisible. For example, often at events, women wearing medals are asked if they are wearing their husband's, son's or father's medals. This completely discounts and diminishes the courageous acts of Canada's woman Veterans.

As we take the time in the upcoming week to reflect on our past, it's vital we don't make the same mistakes moving forward. All of Canada's Veterans deserve our heartfelt respect, support, and gratitude.

November 5-11 marks Veterans week. During this week there will be ceremonies and speeches across Canada to commemorate Canada's Veterans. This is an important time for us to reflect on the legacy of Canada's Armed Forces. It is also a time to honour those who have given so much in the service of Canadians. We must never forget those who have given so much to protect our rights and freedoms.

This Remembrance Day, I urge you to reflect on the people who answered the call that very few of us answer, and what they gave up in doing so.

I encourage everyone to support the <u>Royal Canadian Legion Poppy Campaign</u>, which raises crucial funds to support Veterans and their families. These poppies are an important reminder about the sacrifices made throughout our history. They also bring to mind those Canadians who are currently serving or who have just returned home.

I remain firmly committed to addressing the pervasive discrimination that continues in our institutions, which too frequently dismisses and marginalizes Indigenous Peoples.
